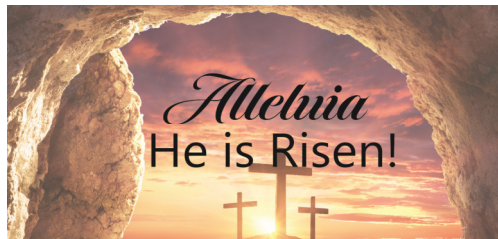

We must witness the hope that Jesus' resurrection brings to our world that seeks a reason to hope again. In the midst of our difficulties, weaknesses,

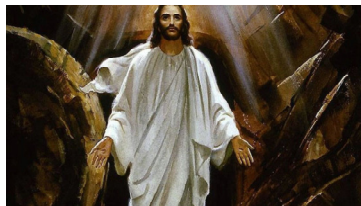
and fears, God sends Jesus to be our hope. We must renew each day this divine life offered to us in Jesus' resurrection. This is our feast of Victory!

Praying the Stations of the Resurrection—The Way of Light

The Via Lucis—The Way of Light is a devotion similar to the Via Crucis—the Way of the Cross. This lesser-known devotion, also known as the Stations of the Resurrection, is approved by the Congregation for Divine Worship and the Discipline of the Sacraments.

The devotion celebrates the fifty days of Easter and key events of Christ’s life aligning to the devotional life of the Church. In this positive vision, we journey from an experience of suffering to the hope of arriving at man’s true end: liberation, joy, and peace—essential paschal values.

All are welcome to First Friday Mass on **April 5 at 6:30 pm** followed by Adoration with Benediction including the Stations of the Resurrection Prayers.

The Stations of the Resurrection will also be prayed on First Friday on May 3 and June 7.

544. How does Jesus teach us to pray?

Jesus teaches us to pray not only with the Our Father but also when he prays. In this way he teaches us, in addition to the content, the dispositions necessary for every true prayer: purity of heart that seeks the Kingdom and forgives one's enemies, bold and filial faith that goes beyond what we feel and understand, and watchfulness that protects the disciple from temptation.

545. Why is our prayer efficacious?

Our prayer is efficacious because it is united in faith with the prayer of Jesus. In him Christian prayer becomes a communion of love with the Father. In this way we can present our petitions to God and be heard: "Ask and you will receive that your joy may be full" (John 16:24).

Archbishop Miller's Easter Message 2024

From time immemorial, people have asked whether there really is life after death and, if so, what kind of life it would be. Some have suggested that life simply ends in nothingness. For them, the world is just a war-torn and violent waiting room where death has the last word.

We Christians, on the other hand, today shout "Alleluia" because Jesus Christ has been raised from the dead. His Resurrection is neither a myth nor a dream. It wasn't a vision. Nor is it a fairy tale. It is a singular and unrepeatable event in the history of the cosmos.

At Easter we celebrate that He conquered sin and death, opening us to a future of hope. Thanks to Him, evil has been robbed of its power; failure can no longer hold us back from starting anew; and death has become a passage to eternal life.

This Easter the Church invites us to relive the thrilling experience of the disciples who encountered Jesus as a living Person. Today we too can encounter Him.

He might be right there before us: in a troubled son or daughter; a difficult spouse or family situation; a neglected person clamouring for our attention. He is waiting to be encountered as Risen Lord, but He wears many disguises. He is found in the poor, the sick, the trafficked, the addicted, the imprisoned, the abandoned, the homeless, and the marginalized in our midst.

As Bishop Robert Barron has written: "It all comes down finally to this: if Jesus was not raised from death, Christianity is a joke. But if he did rise from death, then Christianity is the fullness of God's revelation, and Jesus must be the absolute center of our lives. There is no third option."

If you sincerely seek the Lord, rest assured that you will find Him. Indeed, He will come to find you, to meet you. Calling you by name, He will take you into the intimacy of His love and ask you, in return, to share your experience with others.

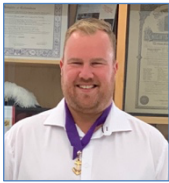

Chaplain's Message



We believe in Jesus' Resurrection which changes the past, present and future.

Jesus' resurrection is the most important event in world history. It changes people with faith. It is so great it touches the past, present, and future. First, we remember the past. Jesus rose from the dead. We

believe this based on the witness of Jesus' earliest disciples and the oral and written revelation the Holy Spirit communicated to the church. St. Paul tells us if Jesus has not been raised, our preaching is void of content and our faith is empty too. We are false witnesses, liars, of all people most to be pitied. But if Christ is risen, we can have joy, peace, and meaning in our lives.

Besides the past hope, we Christians have a future hope. We like Christ, will be raised from the dead to live the fullness of everlasting life. We might find it easier to accept and believe in Christ's resurrection than our own future resurrection. Christ is the divine Son of the Father. God became man to work for our salvation. It is natural he should be resurrected. We are only human, mortal, we are imperfect, and sometimes we sin. Faith in Christ's resurrection leads us to faith in our own resurrection. Our Easter celebration of Jesus' resurrection is without meaning if we do not have our own hope for bodily resurrection after we die. Jesus has destroyed death by overcoming sin. In death we are not annihilated, nor do we disintegrate. We transition to a higher existence as Jesus did. Our well-founded faith and hope is that death leads to our future resurrection.

Third, Christians have resurrection hope for the present. We have the promise of a new life of love, joy, and peace, of heaven on earth. Heaven begins now in this life. If we want to live with Christ in the happiness of eternity, we must live with him now the way he lived on earth. Jesus taught people love. First love the Lord your God with all your mind, strength, and heart. Then from the power of the Holy Spirit who lives in us, you love your neighbour as you love yourself. Love everyone, even enemies. Love as Jesus loved sacrificially, caring, giving, to serve God and our brothers and sisters in love, in our words and actions.

Jesus' Easter resurrection is past, present, and future. Receiving the risen Lord in the Holy Eucharist, we are strengthened in our faith in Christ's resurrection in the past, to live the loving life of Christ in the present where we receive a token, a down payment of our own resurrection life in the future forever in heaven.

A happy and blessed Easter to all of you and your families. The Lord is risen! He is risen, indeed, Hallelujah!

Bikes for Farm Workers BC OLOV Council 10889

As members of the Knights of Columbus, Steve and I have been involved with the Migrant Farm Workers Bike Program, here in Maple Ridge. This program enables the workers to get to and from the fields where they work as well as going out in the community and shop for supplies.

The goal of the Migrant Farm Worker Bike Program is to provide reliable bikes and safety accessories to BC farm workers so that they can travel to their workplace and out into the community. The program is possible through the generosity of local volunteers, non-profit organizations, bike shops, church groups and various businesses. We are all driven by compassion to show our guests Canadian hospitality as they enhance our lives through their hard work, long hours, and minimal pay.

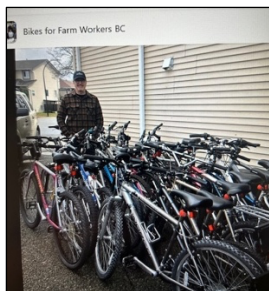
In 2024 we expect to deliver about 250 bikes to the workers. As of March 13-2024, we have given out forty-four bikes with forty in storage. A keynote here is only one individual Steve Nicklen is repairing bikes. My role is to find bikes that people wish to donate to the program. Facebook has been a major source for donations with so many people supporting us. If they cannot donate immediately, they make a note and pass the information to family and friends.
